Last Week

President Elect Rick Vosila never fails to entertain. Last Wednesday evening, as his first slide indicated, Rick presented on the topic of "A brief History of Me" with apologies to Stephen Hawking's 'A Brief History of Time'.

Married for 28 years, and with a 26 year old daughter, Rick grew up in Auburn, and after his most recent home was compulsorily acquired for the M4 East tunnel, now resides in Five Dock.

Rick took us through each phase of his working life with a slide that indicated the technology or event that was current at the time.

The first slide, of a Commodore 64 computer, was appropriate as it came out the same year that Rick commenced employment with IBM, 1982.

In 1994, Rick left IBM to join Uni Foods (Unilever). The Sydney Olympics coincided with a move in 2000 to become CIO of Unilever.

Looking for new challenges took Rick in 2002 to Goodman Fielder. However, following Burns Philip's hostile takeover of Goodman Fielder in 2003, Rick moved on to Chubb. Chubb, in turn, were taken over by United Technologies.

Seeking a change from corporate life, or at least being an employee of large organisation, Rick started his own IT consultancy.

In 2009, he re-joined UTC, United Technologies, where he stayed until launching his IT business, Sognos, in 2016. Sognos is a Microsoft Certified Partner and specialises in the transformation and optimisation of field service operations.

The Rotary Foundation

PDG Paul Reid shared Strathfield's recent and total contributions to the Rotary Foundation by noting that we have donated just under \$108,000 since 2013. To put this in perspective, Paul indicated that, on average, just \$1,000 is enough to save a life. So 108 people are alive today, thanks to the Rotary Club of Strathfield.

To give an appreciation for the magnitude of the Foundation, in the year 2014/2015, the Foundation provided staggering amounts, including

Global Grants - \$68,700,000 District Grants - \$25,200,000 Polio Plus - \$128,900,000 Peace Scholarships - \$4,000,000

The Polio Plus programme is one of which, as Rotarians, we should be immensely proud. From around 350,000 cases in 1988, in 2016 there have been just 27 reported cases and there is a real hope that the disease can be entirely eradicated.

With impacts such as this, Paul left the Club with a message that, whether today or via bequest, we individually give consideration to supporting the Rotary Foundation.

Rotary Celebrities and Projects

"Change is the law of life. And those who look only to the past or present are certain to miss the future."

Founded in 1947, **the Ambassadorial Scholarships program** was the largest non-governmental and most international scholarship program in the world. Scholars studied in a country other than their own where they serve as unofficial ambassadors of goodwill. Over 37,000 scholars from some 110 countries received scholarships at a cost of almost US\$446 million. The program ended in 2013. Scholarships are now funded by Rotary Foundation district and global grants and are offered directly through Rotary clubs.

November is Rotary Foundation month when it is worth reflecting on the goals of the Rotary Foundation

- 1. Eradicate polio, our top priority
- 2. Build a sense of ownership of our Foundation among Rotarians through their contributions to the Annual Programs Fund, the Permanent Fund, and our Rotary Peace Centres
- 3. Continue our progress on the Future Vision plan and align our service projects with the six areas of focus: Peace and conflict prevention/ resolution, Disease prevention and treatment, Water and sanitation, Maternal and child health, Basic education and literacy, Economic and community development

The Rotary Foundation is now receiving more than \$85 million each year for educational and humanitarian work around the world.
