## Last Week's Guest Speakers: Arie Pappas and Paolo Giammarco

Arie and Paolo treated us last week to two great talks.

Arie commenced the evening outlining his education background his subsequent early However, ever the entrepreneur, Arie's part-time job as an event promoter soon led it to becoming a full-time career. From early popular 'Greek nights' he expanded into the market for cultural events for Croatian, Macedonian and Asian communities. Back in those days (pre-internet) the only way to communicate was via standard mail.

Arie soon released that it was better from him to do the mail-outs than pay someone to do so. Soon his garage was full of mailing equipment and the opportunities to do this for other organisations lead to another change in direction, as this business became his primary focus. Never to stand still. explosion the in electronic communication and the impact it look to have on traditional mail services caused Arie to change tact again, and invest in property section through the management of his boarding houses.

In between all these careers, Arie married Athena and they had two sets of twins (boys and girls) within the space of eighteen months!

As a Rotarian and President of the Meriden P&F Association, Arie is intimately involved in community activities.

Paolo next regaled us with his life story. He was born in Italy where he lived for the first ten years of his life.

It is clear that this upbringing left an indelible and emotional mark on Paolo.

After his father came to Australia, returned to Italy and then came back to Australia, a young Paolo, with very little English, emigrated with the rest of his family in 1957 to join his father.

Paolo clearly worked hard in this new environment. After completing his schooling, he entered a brief, but not entirely satisfying career as an accountant. However, a visit to a

particular building inspired Paolo to find his love of Engineering. He subsequently completed university in the field of Structural and Civil engineering; a profession he continues in to this day.

As well as flying high by obtaining a pilots license, Paolo courted and married Pat and they have four children. The youngest of which, Catherine, is following her father's career in engineering, albeit from the Northern Territory.

## ${\cal R}$ otary Celebrities and Projects

- ❖ The current Pope of the Roman Catholic Church, Pope Francis, was made an honorary member of the Rotary Club of Buenos Aires in 1999.
- Some magnificent projects grow from very small seeds. The Rotary Foundation had that sort of modest beginning.

In 1917 RI President Arch Klumph told the delegates to the Atlanta Convention that "it seems eminently proper that we should accept endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world." A year later the "Rotary Endowment Fund", as it was first labeled, received its first contribution of US\$26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City. Additional amounts small were annually contributed, but after six years the endowment fund had only reached US\$700.

A decade later, The Rotary Foundation was formally established at the 1928 Minneapolis Convention. In 1937 a US\$2 million goal was announced for The Rotary Foundation, but these plans were cut short and was abandoned with the outbreak of World War II.

In 1947, upon the death of Paul Harris, a new era opened for the Rotary Foundation as memorial gifts poured in to honour the founder of Rotary. By 1954 the Foundation received for the first time a half million dollars in contributions in a single year, and in 1965, a million dollars was received.

It is staggering to imagine that from those humble beginnings, The Rotary Foundation is now receiving more than US\$85 million each year for educational and humanitarian work around the world.
