### Last Week's Guest Speaker

Last week's speakers presented a fascinating and enlightening talk on Police Citizens Youth Clubs (PCYC's). The organisation is truly multi-faceted with positive goals and outcomes. This was highlighted during the talk by Senior Constable Gabriella Di Marino and Senior Constable Enzo Silvestro. We learnt that "NSW Police Youth Case Managers (YCM's) are committed to preventing and reducing youth crime.YCM's work with young people aged 10 to 17yrs who come to the attention of police for various reasons, whether by some form of legal action taken against them, such as charge, caution or conference, or by simply being a young person at risk of offending due to welfare, domestic or peer association factors. YCM's are located at local PCYC's and are not attached the local Police Station, as is the case with Youth Liaison officer (YLO) or School Liaison Police Officer (SLP).

#### YCM's conduct two main programs

**Individual Case Management** This program is a voluntary process in which young people are referred to YCM's via a number of agencies as a result of their behaviour and the reasons for this are explored. Assistance can be provided in a variety of ways specific to the young person's circumstances. This may include exploring positive role modeling, their anti-social behavior and the consequences of this risky behavior; referrals to health and wellbeing services for drugs, alcohol and mental health concerns, domestic violence issues, education and employment issues.

The process may require support from other external agencies as well as the young person's family. YCM's will be in regular contact with external agencies and exchanging information with them. Agencies and parents are encouraged to support the young person during this time, to set and maintain appropriate boundaries to increase communication and to explore the progress made by the young person. YCM's will conduct regular home visits to check on the progress of the young person and they, in turn will be encouraged to attend the club on a regular basis to meet with the YCM and engage in club activities. Where necessary, YCM's may attend school and/or interagency meetings to assist in the management of the young person's behavior


**Police Targeted Program** These programs are conducted on a term-by-term basis. These programs generally involve a specific school or community group experiencing a specific crime trend or issue. The program is generally conducted one or two days a week, for 8 to 10 weeks at a time. The programs

are reliant upon suitable funding, suitable participants, and will include a number of in house presenters, a physical and sport component, a cultural component and regular crime prevention workshops. These programs are designed to educate the youths on and relevant topics and to enhance better decision-making skills. Ultimately these programs help reduce offending or exposure to crime as well as addressing absenteeism from school. Generally lunch and transport is provided as well as various program resources. At the conclusion the behaviours of program are reviewed. YCM's support the local Police and promote the activities of the PCYC, regularly attending community events together.

The PCYC's are a non government, charitable organisation and conduct numerous activities for the young at a minimal fee."
