Last Week's Guest Speaker PDG Paul Reid

With November being Rotary Foundation Month, it was timely that PDG Paul Reid presented details on Rotary's own charity; the Rotary Foundation. Started by Arch C Klump in 1917, with a first donation of \$26.50, the Foundation continues to this day to live up to it motto of "Doing good in the World". It does this via its mission to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

Notable milestones of the Foundation include 1929 First grant of \$500 to a crippled child 1947 Ambassadorial scholarship awarded 1965 Group Study Exchange (GSE) commenced 1978 Launched of the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3H program) 1985 Polio Plus commenced, continuing to the present time 1999 Rotary Peace Fellowship program established 2009 Future Vision Plan, the new grant model that enhances the scope, impact, and sustainability of humanitarian and educational projects 2013 Area of Focus initiative, that involves promoting peace, fighting disease, providing clean water, saving mothers and children, supporting education, and growing local economies

Paul shared Strathfield's recent and total contribution to the Foundation by noting that we have donated \$454 in 2013/2014, \$2,372 in 2014/2015 and \$5,410 in 2015/2016, bringing our total to just under \$108,000. To put that in perspective, Paul indicated that, on average, just \$1,000 is enough to save a life. So 108 people are alive today, thanks to the Rotary Club of Strathfield.

To give an appreciation for the magnitude of the Foundation, in the year 2014/2015, the Foundation provided staggering amounts, including Global Grants - \$68,700,000 District Grants - \$25,200,000 Polio Plus - \$128,900,000 Peace Scholarships - \$4,000,000 The Polio Plus programme is one of which, as Rotarians, we should be immensely proud. From around 350,000 cases in 1988, in 2016 there have been just 27 reported cases and there is a real hope that the disease can be entirely eradicated.

With impacts such as this, Paul left the club with a message that, whether today or via bequest, we individually give consideration to supporting the Rotary Foundation.

Rotary Celebríties and Projects

On May 5, 1961, **Alan Shepard** became the first American in space. On this flight, Shepard did not orbit Earth. He flew 116 miles high, then he came back down safely. Shepard was an honorary Rotarian in Derry, New Hampshire USA.

November is Rotary Foundation month when it is worth reflecting on the goals of the Rotary Foundation

- 1. Eradicate polio, our top priority
- 2. Build a sense of ownership of our Foundation among Rotarians through their contributions to the Annual Programs Fund, the Permanent Fund, and our Rotary Peace Centres
- 3. Continue our progress on the Future Vision plan and align our service projects with the six areas of focus: Peace and conflict prevention/ resolution, Disease prevention and treatment, Water and sanitation, Maternal and child health, Basic education and literacy, Economic and community development

The Rotary Foundation is now receiving more than \$85 million each year for educational and humanitarian work around the world. David Croft
