President's Report





My fellow Rotarians and friends of Rotary,

As members of the Rotary family, we are 1.2 million neighbours, friends, and community leaders who come together to create positive, lasting changes in our communities and worldwide. Our diverse occupations, cultures and backgrounds give us a unique perspective. Our shared

passion for service drives us to take on the world's most challenging problems.

Rotary Club guiding principles include the Four-Way Test (Truth, Fairness, Goodwill and Friendship). Other principals involve Rotary's commitment to **Service above Self**, which is channelled through the Five Avenues of Service: Club, Vocational, Community, International and Youth & New Generations.



As we reached fifteen weeks of our Rotary year this week, it is good to have a snapshot of our progress so far. With our energetic board members and generous club members, we have achieved significant milestones in all the avenues of service despite the pandemic lockdown, restrictions and without in-person meetings.

Club Service:

We reached the fifty-member mark last month, at which we had five new members inducted, coinciding with the Governor's visit.

- We are happy to announce that onefifth of our members are females.
- All our online meetings were wellattended by members, with an average of 30 members attending last month.
- We also introduced a 100% Attendance Recognition Program and have already have three lucky winners.

Community Service:

- Cool room project to support the community through "Parish Pantry" of St. Paul's Church at Burwood.
- "Mind Your Health" social media campaign with a Multicultural NSW Grant.
- GoFundMe online fundraising to support all our club's social service projects.
- COVID-19 Vaccination Promotion via social media.
- Mental Health Day Event on 31 October 21
- Supporting the District Governor's Partner Program, the 'Aboriginal Child and Family Health Program 2021-23'.

Vocational Service:

- Foundation Grant empowering indigenous youth for workforce. A landmark project to help the indigenous community obtain beginner skills in the new digital and technological world.
- Organising the annual "Police Awards" for the local community's law enforcement officers.

International Service:

- The inaugural AHIMSA Peace Symposium 2021, a cultural diversity initiative.
- Partnership contribution of AUD25,000 for Matching Grant

Projects by **Australian Health Humanitarian Aid.**

- Global Grant Project on COVID-19 and Maternal Health in Northern Sri Lanka to provide medical equipment worth USD90,000 for an Operation Theatre and COVID-19 Treatment Centre.
- Global Grant Project on COVID-19 and Basic Health in Southern India. Due to COVID, pregnant women cannot travel to Tiruvannamalai General Hospital; the goal is to equip these remote primary health care centres to save lives.

Youth & New Generations:

- Formation of Rotaract Club of Strathfield.
- NYSF nominations for three candidates
- District Grant application for 'Peter Smith Youth Awards' for Youth Empowerment

I am sincerely grateful to our board of directors and all our club members for initiating and executing all these projects. Our club is full of encouraging members. One word of encouragement can be enough to spark one's motivation to continue with a difficult challenge. Unfortunately, we have not yet met in person since we started our Rotary year on the 1st of July 21. But our close fellowship and the bond of friendship in our club is helping us to survive strong winds.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA)

The District 9675 RYLA committee has advised that the 2022 RYLA program is going ahead from the 3rd-9th of January 2022 at Stanwell Tops.

The committee is monitoring the COVID-19 situation and developing a response plan.

RYLA is a life-changing leadership program for young adults aged around 19 to 25. The committee has advised that they will consider applications from 18 year olds.

The 7-day program typically has 75 participants and focuses on leadership, personal development, teamwork and community awareness.

RYLA features presentations from many experts who generously donate their time

and experience to further the development of young leaders. The program combines workshops and presentations to fully explore the fundamentals of effective leadership.

RYLA gives young people the chance to build their communication and problemsolving skills. They will learn from community leaders, peer mentors, special guest speakers and Rotarians. This is both a challenging and rewarding program.

Awardees will form amazing connections with their fellow participants, and the impact on their lives will go well-beyond the 7 days they spend together.

I probably walked past him when I was visiting the companies of his past corporate life. When I was selling chemical processing equipment, that may have been utilised to make the products that he marketed.



Speaker for this week: Raymond McCluskie

Our own long-standing member, PP Raymond McCluskie was recently recipient of a 2021 Recognition Award from the Winston Churchill Memorial Trust.

Raymond will tonight elaborate on the Winston Churchill Memorial Trust, and the background to his award.

Raymond McCluskie joined the Rotary Club of Strathfield in 1980 when Dr Brian Hennell was president and when Raymond was Principal of Strathfield TAFE College.

He has held many Strathfield Rotary club portfolios including secretary and treasurer. He was President at the turn of the century and was an assistant governor in 2007. He was also Treasurer of the International Fellowship of Rotarian Astronomers

He is the owner of Mr Computer Tutor, a boutique educational business that has

provided tuition specialising in programs for seniors and those transitioning into a new job requiring computing.

He has looked after the Club webpage ever since it was introduced at the turn of the millennium.

Raymond has a MSc degree in Mathematics and Physics and a postgraduate qualification in Education Nearly 50 years ago Raymond was awarded a Winston Churchill fellowship by the Winston Churchill Trust to investigate the development of an undergraduate TAFE program in environmental science where he visited the "Red Brick" universities in the UK.

Shaping Rotary's Future

"2021 marks the centenary of Rotary's establishment in Australia, New Zealand

and the Pacific countries, and the challenge is to secure our future. To do this, we need to ensure that Rotary remains relevant, contemporary and flexible.

At the recent Zone 8 Virtual Conference, Past RI President Barry Rassin announced that our Zone would be a pilot study for "Shaping Rotary's Future".

The Zone Pilot Strategy in Zone 8 (Australia / New Zealand / Pacific Islands / New Guinea & Timor Leste) will confirm the wider regionalisation structure for Rotary across the globe. The reason that Zone 8 was selected for this pilot is that we realised the need and moved towards a possible solution earlier than the other regions who are suggesting similar changes to Zone 8.

This Pilot Study will change the roles of District Governors and Assistant Governors where Governors will move to sectional Leadership roles Assistant Governors will have wider leadership roles for groups of 10 – 30 Clubs (yet to be determined), rather than just being a link to the District Governor. This will be a "change management" process through 2022-2024.

Should the pilot go ahead under the current timeline a fully functional Regional Council will be in place and operating from 1 July 2024. An interim council, managed by the currently elected District Governors Nominee will operate during the lead up to year (2023 – 2024) as part of their responsibilities at the time.

The Regional Council will be **an elected body** with members being in the position for 3 years. The Sectional Leadership Group will **be elected** and will be required for a 4 year term. This will be 2

years in preparation and 2 years as a full member.

Some current District administration, grant management, membership, dues collection, insurance, international reporting, media contact and national entity functions will be transferred to the regional level to release Districts from the current operations requiring the leadership attention.

Further detailed information will be provided to Clubs as we are advised."
