supports activities and training to improve education for all children and literacy for children and adults.


The Rotary Foundation enables Rotarians to ensure that all people have sustainable access to basic education and literacy by:

- Increasing adult literacy in communities.
- Working to reduce gender disparity in education.
- Supporting studies for career-minded professionals related to basic education and literacy.

Therefore, the Rotary Club of Strathfield is looking forward to structuring a technical training program, running it, and designing a pattern program for other Rotary clubs to be able to run and help the Indigenous community.



empower communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity in education and increase adult literacy. In order to achieve our goal, we are embarking on a program by **preparing indigenous communities for the workforce** through the Technical and Life-skills Training Program.

The purpose of the project is to help the indigenous community to get trained in beginner skills in the new digital and technological world. The demand for IT, technical or soft presentation knowledge has increased dramatically in the last few years. The skill-set requirements are high in understanding how to use computer apps and IT tools, how to deal with security, how to get access to mailboxes or any other general IT skills. Soft presentation skills are in demand to understand how to present yourself, how

The community needs will be met by creating and defining a program of the seminars and classes, to identify how the materials can be distributed to the indigenous community, to find potential teachers who can help us validate the program, and to present this program to other clubs. The following community should be involved: indigenous community organisation representatives, teachers, students, and club members. The program objectives are to teach and

The program objectives are to teach and deliver the three main knowledge spheres:

 IT skills - Such skills will open the potential to understand the basic package of the program available on the market to open skills such as structuring CV, writing a cover letter, sending an email, searching on the internet and so on.

- Technical skills For trade specialities, it will open the opportunity to learn about new tools, such as digital levels, understanding electrical principles, mobile apps for construction sites, managing types of machines and so on.
- Soft skills It will link and open the basic skills of presentation, understanding people skills, understanding how to speak, how to use presentation materials and how to write cover letters.

The Rotary Club of Strathfield plans to run a 3-stage approach to delivering this program:

- Facilitate the structure of online courses and in-person workshops and seminars for entry-level students.
- Set collaboration with educational organisations such as TAFE or similar for further studies
- Package a guide for other clubs or institutional organisations to scale up this program.

The project is planned to be run on a yearly basis. The course materials would be available for distribution throughout the year to indigenous students. Students who pass the program will receive certificates. Their acquired technical skills will enable them to work more easily with modern technologies in the workplace and identify their passion and interests to further their technical education.

The main differentiators of this program compared to other similar educational institutions would be:

 Collaborating with Indigenous Community Organisations, we will be going to the community instead of the students coming to the institutions.

- Programs will be based on all three modes, online, face-to-face as well as hybrid.
- Short courses designed to be the catalyst between the fresh students and the established institutions such as universities, TAFE and technical institutions.
- Designed to enable the students to test their aptitude for education, including their passion, direction and career guidance and development.
- Professional career guidance and counselling will be integrated into our programs at a high level.

Our ultimate objective is to bring the underprivileged community to a level playing field and give them a platform to enter the workforce in Australia.

As I mentioned in our last week's bulletin, in order to take this program to the District level after piloting it from the Rotary Club of Strathfield, we approached our District Governor Jeremy Wright for assistance. We are glad to note that the DG Jeremy is looking at our request very favourably.

This ambitious program with a worthy cause will be led by our own experts, Vocational Service Director Alexey Prokopenko and the former TAFE College Principal PP Raymond McCluskie.

Speaker from last week: Fiona Martin

Dr Fiona Martin – MP for Reid, joined us in quarantine, she just got back from parliamentary meeting. I am very thankful that she spares her time to update us on what is going on locally, state and federal during this COVID uncertainty. She was hoping to finished at 8PM to rest, but was generously stayed to answered our questions till around 8.20PM.

Update 1: Effect of COVID on mental health

There will be a report release around November 2021 for "Mental Health and Suicide Prevention". Some of the recommendations include:

 Extending the standard consultation hours from 19 to 40 hours, as some conditions are treatable but take longer.

- Engage the GP network, have programs to train GP so they can also help their patients.
- There is a shortage of psychologists in Australia hence looking at ways to incentivise or encourage people to take up study in mental health (universities and colleges).

Update 2: COVID restrictions

- Lobby with the state government to ease restrictions to LGA Strathfield and Burwood as there are low active cases and high vaccination rate.
- The NSW government will open slowly (ease some restrictions) when the vaccination rate hit 80%, which is estimated to be around mid-October. {Since the Wed night meeting, Premier Glady have announced the roadmap and the expected date is 18th October}.
- Travel passport : people who are coming to Australia need to have

- vaccinated and the vaccination brand needs to be part of the Australia government endorse list.
- COVID symptoms in young kids are mild and not as severe, 2% of children who get COVID are hospitalise not because they need treatment but because their parents have COVID and are in hospital and so no one to look after them.
- On 14th September, Fiona and Associate Professor Thomas Gottlieb, Head of Infectious Diseases at Concord Hospital will be hosting a COVID-19 vaccine information forum with the local community of REID to discuss the importance of getting vaccinated.

His community activities began in 1989 when, together with his wife Marilyn, they launched Red Nose Day in NSW, and a successful prevention campaign for Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS).

From 2004 Jeremy was the founding Chief Officer of Executive MS Research Australia.

Jeremy joined the Rotary Club of Sydney Cove in 2009 and has been involved in Indigenous Affairs, global grants and the Climate Action and Peace Committee.

Jeremy has been the Chair of the District Grants Sub- Committee for 5 years."
