Our own club member Anjali Jain gave us an insightful interview into her life and even sang for us!








Inspirational speaker Jo Cooper talked passionately about bullying and Anita Robinson from our Rotary District gave a thoughtful presentation on ROMAC.

In the second half of the year, we had Grange Chung, Liberal candidate for the seat of Reid, and our own member and Mayor of Strathfield J.P. Baladi. The Interact leadership teams from Homebush Boys High School and Meriden Girls visited our club and listened to a presentation by Rotary District Interact Chair Kerrie Guillaume. Robin Baird from Sydney Metro shared exciting developments and future Metro plans. Greg Molloy shared his financial wisdom, and finally Anthony Hartcher led an enthusiastic interactive discussion about well-being.









The Zonta Project was a wonderful youth service project initiative from the Strathfield Girls High School Zonta Club, the Homebush Boys High School Interact Club, and the Zonta Club of Sydney West Inc. Together, the girls and boys assembled 1,000 birthing kits to send to developing countries. It was a great opportunity for collaboration between the two local schools to work together on a project which was educational, raising awareness of the challenges of childbirth still facing many women around the world and making a real contribution to those in need.

This project showed how young people can make a real difference in the world through kindness and teamwork. It helped support mothers in need while also encouraging the students to grow as caring and thoughtful leaders. The experience was a reminder that helping others can be both meaningful and rewarding for everyone involved.





International Service

This past year has been a rewarding chapter for Bradley Ayres in his role as International Director, marked by consistent engagement and meaningful contributions. He had the privilege of attending the weekly Meriden Interact meetings throughout the year, offering support and mentorship to future leaders. A key highlight was the annual Meriden Interact Dance on Friday, 23 May 2025, made memorable with the invaluable support of Steven, Nicholas, Janelle, and Anjali.

Beyond Interact, it was a fulfilling year of supporting initiatives that celebrate youth achievement. Bradley was actively involved in the end-of-year Rotary Citizenship Prizes, where sixteen outstanding students from local schools were recognised for their exemplary service and character. His contribution to the Strathfield Youth Achievement Awards was also both busy and deeply rewarding, with 36 awards presented to young people who live, work, or study in Strathfield and surrounding LGAs.

On the international front, a major milestone was the club's participation in the District Polio Train event on 24 October 2024. Meeting the train at Strathfield Station, the club proudly presented a cheque for \$1,950, symbolising \$10 for each unique station visited by the campaign team. With a strong foundation in place, the coming year will focus on deeper engagement in international partnerships, expanded global service initiatives, and meaningful cross-cultural collaboration. Barbecue Trailer

For many years, the club's BBQ trailer had been stationed at the Strathfield Council facilities, quietly serving as a symbol of past events and community service. In 2024, the Council requested its removal to free up much-needed space. In response, the club invited members to help find a practical solution—whether through sale or responsible disposal.

Thomas D'Souza took the lead in coordinating the effort, successfully arranging a sale to Top Dollar, who purchased the trailer for its scrap value of \$500 and also managed its removal. The Council expressed satisfaction with the outcome, having regained valuable space while maintaining a positive partnership with the club.

This simple yet effective action reflects the club's responsiveness, resourcefulness, and commitment to service—values central to Vocational Service. It also demonstrates the club's active role in responsible asset management and its dedication to fostering strong, respectful relationships with local stakeholders throughout the 2024–25 Rotary year.





Treasurer Matters

As the Rotary year draws to a close on 30 June 2025, Treasurer Charles Pitt expresses his sincere gratitude to former Treasurer Rod McDougall for his invaluable support in facilitating a smooth transition into the role. Rod's guidance has been instrumental throughout the year, particularly during a period of operational change.

With the change in caterers at the Strathfield Golf Club, the club implemented a new pre-booking system requiring members to confirm attendance and prepay for meals ahead of meetings. This marked a shift from the traditional practice of paying on arrival. While the change was initially met with hesitation, members have gradually adapted—and flexibility remains in place to ensure all are welcomed to dine together, regardless of prepayment.

Special thanks go to Rod McDougall for his assistance in implementing the new payment system, including the setup of a debit card facility with the bank. Additionally, the club has adopted the MYOB accounting system, which offers the benefit of bank feed integration and will significantly streamline accounting processes moving forward.

As always, the club has remained committed to its mission of supporting youth, community, and health-focused initiatives. This year has been no exception. A detailed list of beneficiaries of the club's financial support is included in this report, along with a record of members and friends who have generously contributed financially to the club's efforts.

While the final financial statements are pending, early indications suggest the club will finish the year with a modest surplus. Retained income and reserve funds remain in place, including a \$40,000 Reserve Fund held in an interest-bearing deposit, with interest credited to the club's operating account. The audited financial statements will be circulated to members prior to the Annual General Meeting



The club extends its sincere appreciation to James Heesh, Partner at Hales and Redon Chartered Accountants, who has once again provided a professional audit of the club's accounts on a probono basis.

During the year, the Board made the decision to retire the Club's Utility and BBQ trailer. With storage facilities no longer available and the equipment in disrepair and underused, the Board determined that hiring equipment when needed would be a more cost-effective and practical alternative. Although this marks the end of an era in how the club managed its BBQ operations, the decision reflects a thoughtful approach to resource management and future needs.
