Last Week's Presentation

Visit by DG Paul Reid

Our guest speaker was DG Paul Reid. Paul was introduced by PDG Harley Tarrant. Harley advised us that Paul had been an Assistant Governor in his year.

Paul advised us that our Club was the twentieth that he had visited since being appointed DG and that he had two clubs to go. Paul expressed the hope that we would be full of "Rotary spirit" by the end of the evening.

Paul reminded us that the theme for this year is "The future of Rotary is in your hands". He told us that the themes for prior years such as "Make dreams real" don't end with the end of the year but continue on to guide and inspire us.

Paul informed us that his journey began in May 2007. Harley had been one of the first to contact him to congratulate him and offer advice.

Paul advised us that he had undergone considerable training for his role as DG and had attended two Rotary Leadership Institutes. These are attended by DGs Elect from around the world.

Whilst everyone was looking forward to receiving their "jackets" there was a rumour that they may be tartan as John Kenny is from Scotland. It was with some relief that they discovered that only the lining was tartan (being the Black Watch tartan). The

attendees were addressed by John Kenny and informed of the theme for the year. Paul told us that whilst he loved being DG, at the end of the day he is a Rotarian with the responsibilities that entailed.

Paul stated that the strength of Rotary lies in the strength of the clubs. A strong club does well in the community. Paul listed some of the achievements of our Club including our significant fund raising efforts for the Trish Foundation and our involvement with the Youth Programs.

Paul advised us that Bill Gates Jnr had addressed the attendees at the Institute and informed them that last year his foundation had given \$100m and that today he was giving \$255m for polio eradication and that he was giving the money to Rotary because "we trust Rotary".

Paul also told us of a friend who was asked by a couple of women on a train to take care of their sick father as they were unable to. He asked them why they would trust him on such a mission and was told "We saw your Rotary badge and we trust you". This trust from the community means that each Rotarian bears great responsibility in return.

THE FUTURE OF ROTARY IS IN YOUR HANDS

Paul advised us that John Kenny's emphasis for the current year would remain on Water and Sanitation, Health and Hunger and Literacy. Paul also advised us that his chosen project would be

Indigenous Children's Literacy. Paul advised us that his wife Julia was also passionate about this project. The project will be run in partnership with the Fred Hollows Foundation. Packs will be handed to children who will take them home with the literacy benefits extending to the parents.

Paul pointed out that great benefits would accrue from an increase in funds flowing from the clubs to Rotary International. Paul also told us that we should all do our best to introduce new members to Rotary. He told us to wear our Rotary pins proudly and avail ourselves of opportunities to talk up Rotary (including having an "elevator speech" ready).

Paul was thanked by PDG David Croft who also handed a cheque to Julia for the Indigenous Children's Literacy project.
