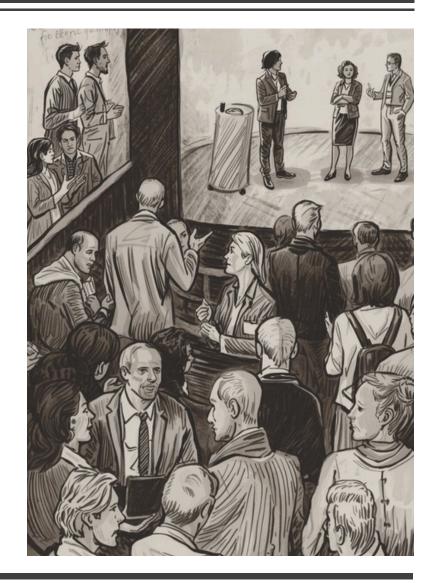

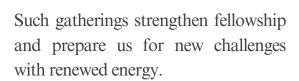
#### FRESH PITCHES & INSPIRING VOICES
