In an unprecedented expansion, membership was boosted by fourteen new members, two only left owing to loss of classification.

## New piano for the Town Hall

A new piano has been installed in Strathfield Town Hall to the great delight of the Strathfield Symphony Orchestra.

The idea of a new piano was first raised some months ago by members of Strathfield Rotary Club.

After consultation with Strathfield Youth Orchestra, the club raised \$2000 towards the cost of a piano suitable for recitals.

Rotary donated this money to Strathfield Council on the understanding that council provide the balance.

Council originally chose a Kawai 3 grand piano, but agreed with Strathfield Symphony Orchestra that this was too light in the lower registers to withstand the sound of a full orchestra.

A quick consultation was held and the orchestra decided to provide the extra funds necessary for a larger piano.

The Kawai 5 will be used for the first time on March 17, when Christine Edwards will play a solo at a concert for senior citizens.

There are hopes, too, that the piano will feature prominently in the orchestra's 10th anniversary concert in April.
