Vocational Service Report



It has been a busy year for Vocational Service! Many events that in previous years had to be postponed due to the Covid pandemic were finally allowed to take place this year. This included the Police Officer of the Year Awards and the Vocational Excellence Awards (formerly the Pride of Workmanship Awards). Both events were a great success. The Police Officer of the Year Awards Event was held on 25 October, and the organising committee was chaired by Steven Argyris. The awards are designed to acknowledge the performance of individual officers from the Auburn and Burwood police area commands. They recognise those officers who have displayed outstanding qualities in their attitude, dedication, approach and performance in the line of duty. It was wonderful to see so many nominees and hear their stories of bravery. There were over 80 attendees on the night. The club donated \$3,000 towards Police Legacy. We received this letter of appreciation from the Auburn Local Area Command:

Community Service Report

Youth Service Report



This was my second year as a Youth Service Director. Rotary sponsors many wonderful youth-focused programs such as RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards), RYPEN (Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment), NYSF (National Youth Science Forum), and MUNA (Model United Nations Assembly). After a couple of years of hiatus due to Covid, RYLA was finally able to take place again in January this year. Our club sponsored and sent three candidates to the much-anticipated camp. They were Ishveen Sehgal, Sarah Safvat and Michael Awad. Both Ishveen and Sarah were part of the Strathfield Rotaract Club, the president and secretary respectively, and Michael works for St Merkorius Charity. The three RYLArians returned and gave excellent presentations of their experiences at RYLA at a Wednesday evenina Rotary dinner meeting. All three spoke about how much they've learnt about leadership and how inspiring the camp was. We also endorsed and sponsored two candidates for NYSF this year.

In March, for the first time we welcomed Interact students from both Homebush Boys High School and Meriden School in Strathfield with their respective teacher/Interact co-ordinators, Ms Georgia Anton (Homebush Boys) and Mr Kuhan Rajalingam (Strathfield Meriden) to one of our Wednesday night Rotary meetings. The student leaders spoke about what they did in the Interact Club, each of these two clubs is involved with many projects. For Homebush Boys it's the Coffee Club, the Breakfast Club, Pancake Day and more. Some of these projects are self-funding, for example the Coffee Club was able to purchase a new fridge. Money is also donated to the RSPCA and the Black Dog Institute amongst others. The Meriden Interact Club has an annual charity dance. The Club donates to the White Ribbon Charity, Anglicare and other charities. It also promotes social awareness of poverty and homelessness within the school and the wider community. The Interactors were also treated to an interview with Rotarian

Dimitry Chugg-Palmer. He is the NSW and Federal Young Liberal President. Dimitry shared fascinating insights into his career as a political staffer.

The Citizenship awards were again organised by Bradley Ayres. A total of 16 certificates and book vouchers were handed out to various local schools and several Rotarians attended and presented those awards at school assemblies.

This year we were able obtain a couple of community grants from the Strathfield Council, one for the Peter Smith Memorial Scholarship, and the other for the Youth Achievement Awards and the Vocational Excellence Awards. The Peter Smith Memorial Scholarship in the sum of \$1000 was presented to Homebush Boys High School, a school that the late Peter Smith was closely affiliated with, to be given to an outstanding student for their contribution towards community service. We are grateful to the Strathfield Council for their continuous support.

The Annual Youth Achievement Awards ceremony was held on the 8th June at the Homebush West Community Centre this year. It was a wonderful evening of celebration and recognition attended by over 100 students, parents, teachers, school representatives, community leaders and Rotarians. Special guests included both local MPs Sally Sitou and Jason Yat-Sen Li, the Mayor of Strathfield Karen Pensabene and several councillors. Five schools were represented in the awards, Homebush Boys High School, the Meriden school, St Patrick's Colleae, Chalmers Road School and Concord High School. I want to thank the organising committee chaired by Ed Dunlop, that included Bradley Ayres, James Cook, Arie Pappas, Nick Hamilton-Kane and Andrew Aravanis as well as MC Dimitry Chugg-Palmer, Rod McDougall and Steven Argyris for their contributions to the evening

Finally, I would like to thank President Andrew Aravanis for a great year, for his good humour and wonderful leadership. It is my honour to serve the club as Youth Service Director and I look forward to another year of service.

Treasurer's Report



Another challenging yet rewarding year. President Andrew kept us all busy – but added a good measure of fun! Our focus this year was on fundraising, local causes and fellowship. It was very much a back to basics year.

A full, audited report of the club's financials will be presented at our AGM and the figures quoted here are subject to audit. The club remains in a sound financial position, with an estimated \$60,000 to be carried forward.

Our signature community events were conducted successfully, including our police awards, vocational excellence awards and youth awards. They are described elsewhere by the responsible directors.

Beneficiaries of our service work are shown in the accompanying table. Once again we were able to support a wide range of causes. Total club payments are estimated to exceed \$19,000. This includes strong support four charity, The Rotary Foundation. Including the personal contributions of club members, a very commendable \$USD6,078 was donated.

Financial support by members and guests at club meetings was again very gratifying. Our weekly raffles and sergeant's fines sessions yielded excellent results – both financial and fellowship! Congratulations to the raffles team and our sergeants who raised over \$8,900.

Special mention must be made of those members and organisations who supported the club through donation and sponsorship – in many cases continuing a tradition of support. See table. Without their generosity - together with the in-kind contributions of numerous members - many of our projects would not have been viable.

The club benefited from a number of grants. See table. Thanks in particular to President Andrew, directors Ying and Alexey, PP Thaya and Secretary Steven for their efforts.
